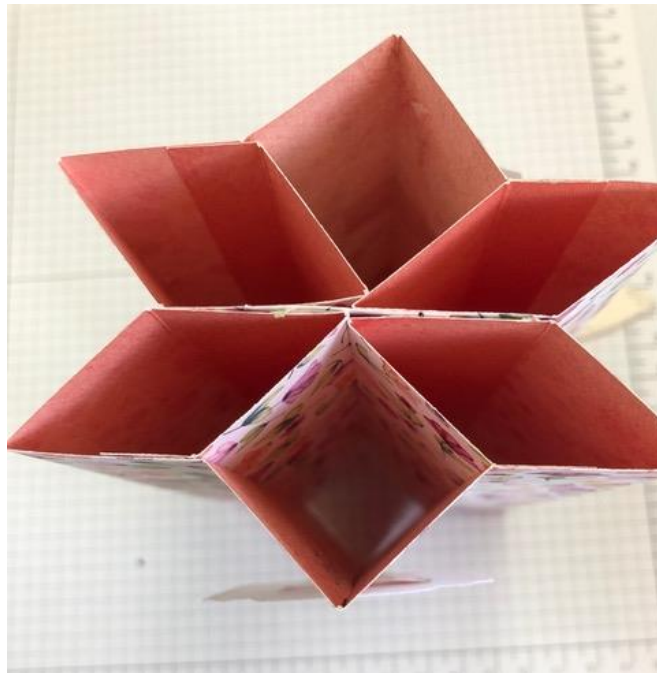


SUDSOL Fancy Fold Swap – OnStage 2024

SUPPLIES

Stamp set – Translucent Florals (162243)

Inks – Berry Burst Classic Stampin' Pad (147143), Parakeet Party Classic Stampin' Pad (159208)

Paper including cutting dimensions –

Delightful Florals Designer Series Paper (162356) 1 12" x 12" sheet

Basic White Cardstock [CS] (159276) 7" x 2 3/4"

Accessories –

Thoughtful Expressions Dies (162821) next to the largest rectangle

Simply Scored Scoring Tools (122334)

INSTRUCTIONS –

Card base

1. Cut 1" off two sides of the 12" x 12" sheet of DSP. This leaves you with an 11" square. Cut this in half at 5 1/2" forming two 11" x 5 1/2" pieces.
2. Place the long side of the DSP along the top of the Simply Scored Scoring Tool and score at 1/2", 1 1/2", 2 1/2", 3 1/2", 4 1/2", 5 1/2", 6 1/2", 7 1/2", 8 1/2", 9 1/2", and 10 1/2".
3. Fold the piece in half at the 5 1/2" score line. Then make mountain folds at 1/2", 1 1/2", 2 1/2", and 3 1/2" score lines. Make a valley fold at 4 1/2". Repeat on the other end, four mountain folds and a valley fold just next to the center. See photo 1.
4. Do steps 2 and 3 with the other piece of DSP.
5. Apply Tear & Tape to the 1/2" sections close to the folds (fold #1 on each end). See Photo 2.

6. Remove the paper backing and bring the 2nd fold to the center 5 ½" score line with the section with the tear & tape inside the fold. See Photo 3. Repeat with other end.
7. Cut one of the 1" x 11" strips of DSP to 5 ½". Apply Tear & Tape to both long edges. See Photo 4.
8. Then apply it to the middle of the flattened piece created in step 6 as shown in photo 5. You get the resulting shape shown in Photo 6.
9. Repeat steps 2 through 6 with the second 11" x 5 ½" piece of DSP.
10. Place the first section down with the 5 ½" x 1" strip up. See photo 7. I have outlined this strip with a pen.
11. Apply Tear and Tape to this second section as shown in Photo 8. If the pattern of the DSP has a direction, be sure both sections are oriented the same. Remove the paper backing and lay this piece down on the first section, carefully lining up the edges. See photo 9.
12. Open the card up. It should look like Photo 10.

Labels

1. Stamp the medium sized flower on one end of the Basic White strip with Berry Burst ink. Stamp it again on a piece of scrap printer paper and cut this image out with paper sips. Apply very thin dots of Multipurpose Liquid Glue on the back and let it dry. The glue will become repositionable. This is a mask.
2. Place the mask over the flower on the CS and stamp the other stamp three times with Granny Apple Green ink. Remove the mask.
3. Stamp Happy Birthday above the flower with Berry Burst ink. Cut out with the next to largest rectangle die.
4. Place that die on the other end of the Basic White strip to guide in positioning the other greeting and stamp the greeting with Berry Burst ink. Cut out with the die.
5. Flatten the card again.
6. Take a remaining piece of the 1" wide DSP and score it in half lengthwise. Then cut into ½" pieces. You will need 8 pieces.
7. Fold these pieces in half. Put liquid glue on one end of one piece and adhere to card with the fold up against the center line under where you want to have the top of the label. Repeat with a second piece opposite it. Be careful not to have any glue ooze out.
8. Do the same with a second pair near the bottom of the label. See photo label 1.
9. Apply glue to the four exposed flaps and place the label on top. See photo Labels 2 & 3
- 10 Repeat on other side.
